

Who are the Dream Team?

In January 2023, Norfolk General Hospital teamed up with the Alzheimer Society of Brant, Haldimand, Norfolk, Hamilton, and Halton and the Brantford Brant Norfolk Ontario Health Team to launch the DREAM Team, which stands for Dementia, Resource, Education, Advocacy, Mentorship.

The DREAM Team is built on the foundation of three critical roles: Dementia Resource Consultant, an Ontario Health at Home Coordinator, and Hospital Navigator. These professionals bridge the gap between emergency care and continuous support, ensuring that patients and their families are guided towards the assistance they require, at the time they need it most.

They operate within the emergency department working closely with their team to quickly determine which patients might be struggling with dementia and guide them to better support options. Plus, they make sure these patients stay tapped into local programs, getting the specialized help they need without having to leave their community or even their home. Dementia

What is Dementia?

Dementia is not a single disease. The word 'dementia' describes a group of symptoms that includes memory loss, difficulties with thinking, problem-solving and language. It is often accompanied by changes in mood, perception and behaviour. Diseases grouped under the term "dementia" are caused by abnormal brain changes and are not a normal part of aging. Alzheimer's disease accounts for 60-80% of cases.

Early diagnosis with proper intervention can help delay the progression of the disease. People can continue to live fully for a long time after diagnosis. While the symptoms will get worse over time, treatment options and therapies can ease symptoms and assist with maintaining independence.
